






What is going to happen with these stories? Well, they are going to be compiled into a little book that will be part of our convention so all your cave family can appreciate what you have to say.

*** November is upon us, and with it national ELECTION DAY on the 5th. Which is also Grotto meeting day this month. This is/was a monumentally important election, can't wait to get up tomorrow and see whether we're going to be representative living in а democracy or a fascist dictatorship, also whether Florida votes to legalize recreational marijuana. (We may need it if the government goes fascist!) Beyond that, of course November also brings us THANKSGIVING, America's traditional feast day, as well as the RIDGEWALKING beginning of SEASON, this year, at least because of the wonderful but dry Indian summer Alabama enjoyed through most of October, the leaves have stayed on the trees longer than usual, and the fall colors are muted. As November gets under way this will change, increasing visibility in the woods, a boon for cavers, ridgewalkers, and hunters alike. The hunting schedule for Skyline WMA was published last month, so I will not revisit it now, will simply repeat my encouragement to be safe out there and report all finds to the

Alabama Cave Survey, even nonqualifying karst features. And be sure to write trip reports for the BGN!

*** Unless the temperatures in north Alabama take a really sharp downturn, we will have to watch out for SNAKES in the woods in this unseasonably warm fall weather. Although a snakebite is no joke, I guess we have it better than the folks in south Florida, battling who are an invasive of Burmese infestation pythons. Originally sold in pet stores, but released in the wild by buyers when the snakes got too large for their liking, these snakes have been multiplying, decimating native wildlife in south Florida. They have been known to swallow full-grown whitetail deer, which typically weigh around 175 pounds, whole, which gives you an idea of the threat level. Recently a 17 foot 2 inch, 195-pound example was caught, although the current record is 18 feet, 205 pounds. Sure am glad I don't have to look out for those on my ridgewalks!

*** Some interesting news reaches us from southern China: investigations in a stream cave in the province of Guanxi, which shares a border with Vietnam, found a previously unknown species of cave fish, designated Paranemachilus liui, or Liu's cave loach. This fish is about 2.5 inches yellowish-brown long, is with smooth scales, bright yellow fins, catfishlike whiskers, and neonyellow eyes. Particularly interesting is that the cave waters that are its habitat are described as "highly polluted." The pollutant was not stated, but obviously Liu's cave loach is a tough and adaptive little these creature. In davs of threatened and vanishing species, it's refreshing to be reminded that there are still some out there we haven't seen before.

*** As a followup to Halloween, SUDDETH OI AN reports that Samhain, the Celtic feast of the dead corresponding to the Christian All Hallow's Eve, is correctly pronounced SOW-wen, the first syllable the same as the word for a female pig. Thanks, Olan, for setting us straight on that. Wouldn't want to mispronounce "Samhain" in conversation.

*** Public service announcement: Overindulgence at the Thanksgiving table may result in increased difficulty in those tight crawls.

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
